

Dear participants, caregivers, and families,

The Greek Peak Adaptive Snowsports board believes very strongly that our participants deserve the best season we can safely provide. We have had to make some big changes so we can safely accommodate as many skiers as possible.

The first and most notable change is that we will be requiring advanced reservations for all participants. We will be using an application called Calendly to set up appointments. There will be more information to come on that. Appointments will be for two and a half hour sessions, and will be staggered over the morning and afternoon in groups of six or seven. Appointments will need to be made by the Tuesday prior to the weekend you/your participant plan to ski.

Spaces will be limited for each session. Participants may only be accompanied by a single caregiver into the building. Before arrival, completion of an online screening form will be required. We will be taking the temperature for the athlete and their caregiver as they arrive at the building.

Snacks for breaks may be brought by individuals, but no community food can be shared. Lunches cannot be consumed by participants in the building as building capacity will be very restricted and distanced.

Athletes will check in at the building, be able to warm up if needed during their session, and will be expected to leave within 15 minutes after the end of their lesson. We will have staggered groupings to ensure that proper social distancing and cleaning protocols can be followed at all times.

Special Olympic participants will have specific time slots. This is necessary to ensure that we are complying with the additional safety measures required of special Olympic participants and coaches. More detailed information will follow as specifics are worked out.

Pricing for the individual lessons will be \$40. Equipment will be included for participants as it has been in the past. Season passes can still be purchased but due to an increase in mountain prices, the passes will be \$330.

We recognize that these new regulations will not be easy to adjust to for some participants. We also acknowledge that some families will have to make arrangements differently than they have done in the past. While we regret the difficulty this may represent for some, as a board we felt strongly that a limited season was better than choosing to close due to COVID. We thank you for your patience and understanding as we navigate these difficult times together.
